The Senior Section may wish to do as many as they can in a day, whilst Rainbows may want to visit one or two in a day - the choice is yours! There are other activities that can be done in unit meetings.

Once you have gained 100 points then you are entitled to be awarded your Girlguiding LaSER London Challenge Badge. Badges will be available from Region Office at a cost of £1.20 each which includes postage and packing. Cheques should be made payable to Girlguiding LaSER. Baden-Powell House 	10	65-67 Queen's Gate, London, SW7 5JS Near: Gloucester Road Station	There is a small exhibition of Lord Baden-Powell's life in Scouting, with artefacts and a souvenir counter. The building opened in 1961, and was originally paid for by Scouts around the world. Outside the building is a statue of Baden-Powell by Don Potter. Pax Lodge 	10	12c Lyndhurst Road, London, NW3 5PQ Near: Belsize Park or Hampstead Health Stations	Pax Lodge is one of five World Centres of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS). Buckingham Palace 	15	Buckingham Palace, London, SW1A 1AA Near: Victoria Station	The 1st Buckingham Palace Company was formed in 1937 to allow the then Princess Elizabeth (the current Queen) to be a Girl Guide. A Brownie Pack was also opened at the same time for Princess Margaret. Peter Pan Statue 	10	Kensington Gardens, Hyde Park, London, W2 2UH Near: Lancaster Gate Station	The bronze statue of Peter Pan is in Kensington Gardens, next to Hyde Park. The exact location was chosen by Peter Pan's author, J.M. Barrie. Barrie lived close to Kensington Gardens and published his first Peter Pan story in 1902, using the park for inspiration. BP Memorial (Westminster Abbey) 	10	Westminster Abbey, 20 Dean's Yard, Westminster, London, SW1P 3PA Near: Westminster Station	Inside Westminster Abbey, in the south aisle of the Nave, there is a memorial to Lord and Lady Baden-Powell. All the girls who worked for MI5 between 1914 and 1918 were aged from 14 to 16. The secret role of the girls was uncovered when Girlguiding and MI5 researched their histories as part of the centenary celebrations.
